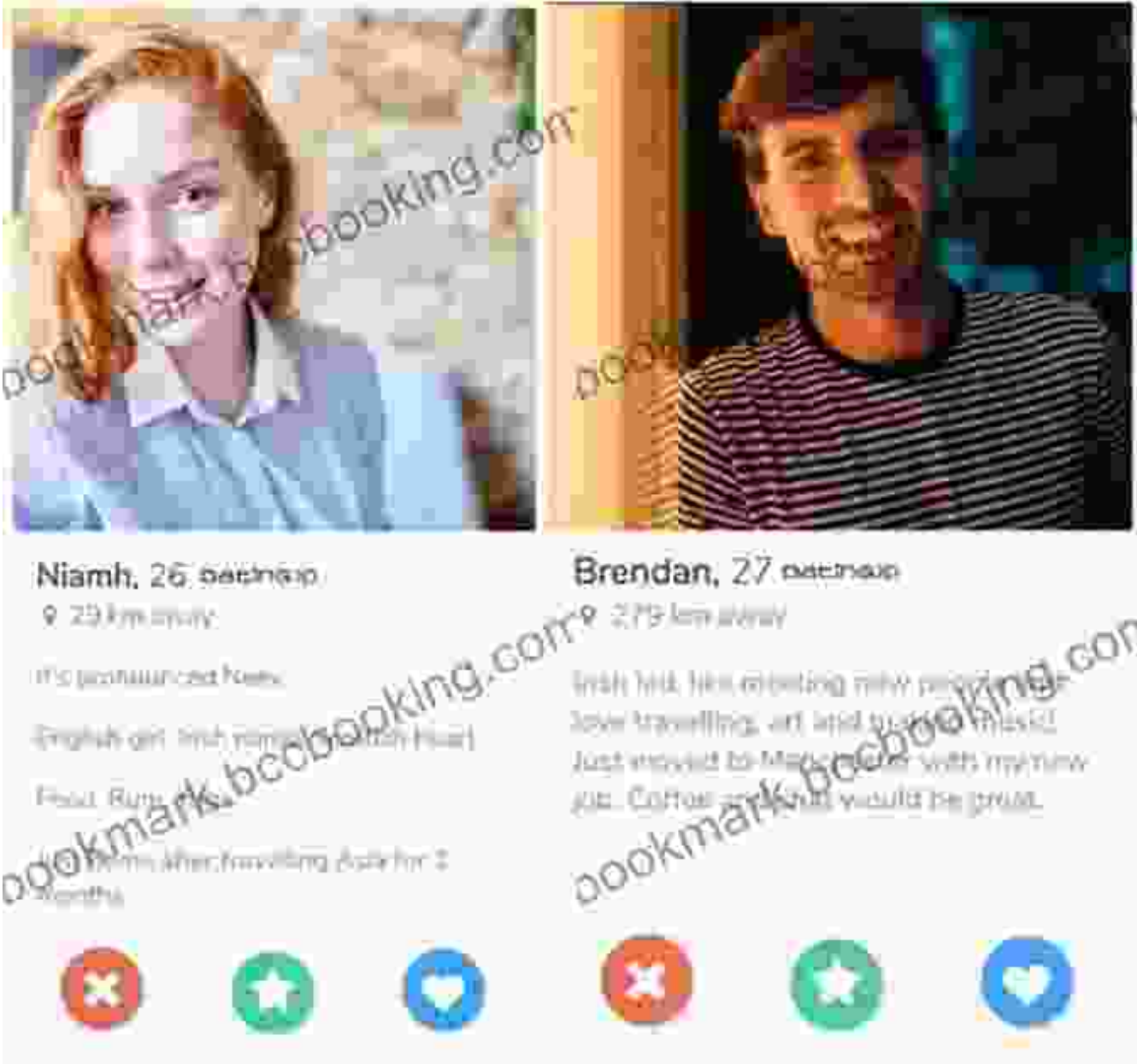
3. Write a detailed bio

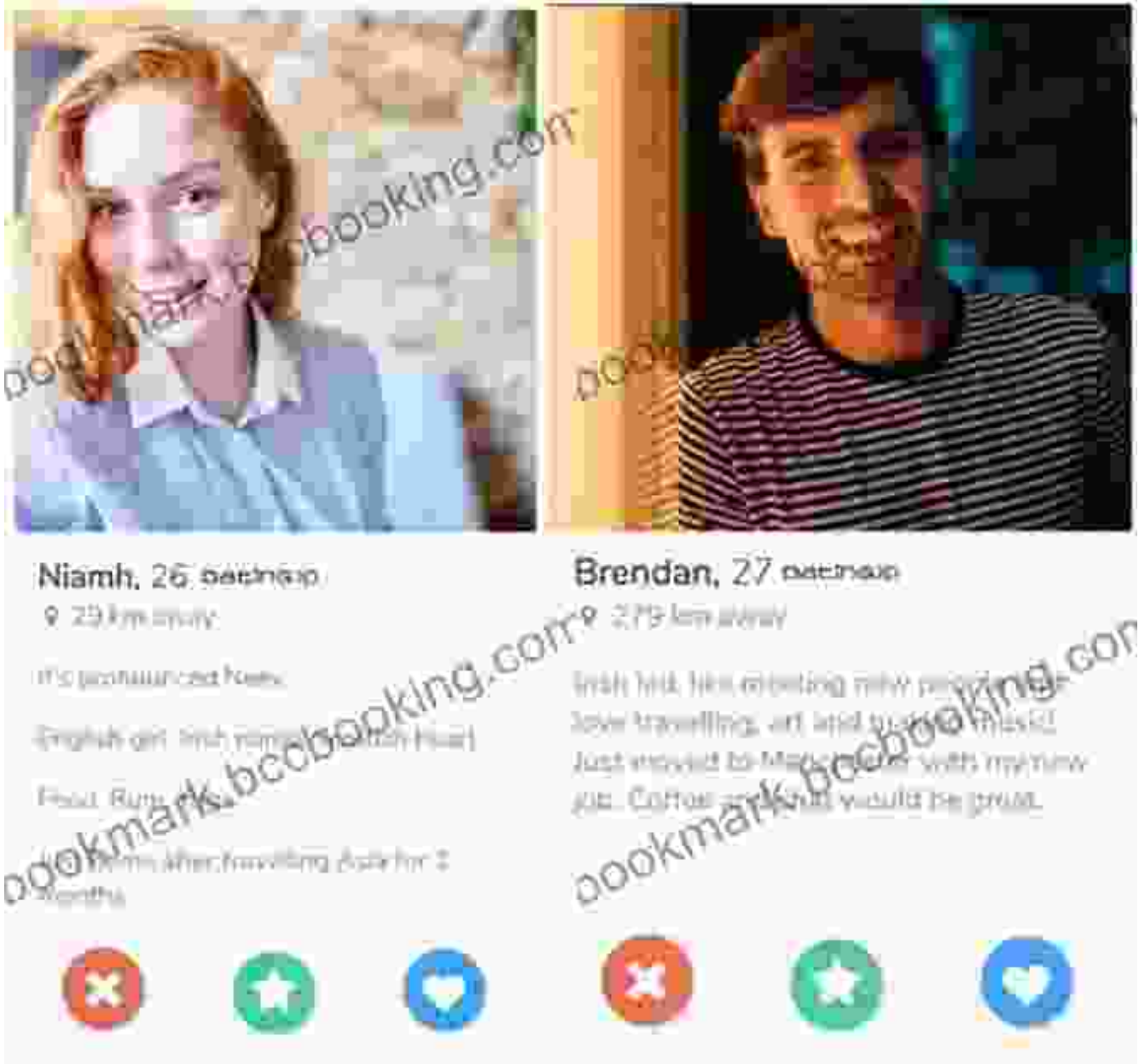
5. Proofread your profile

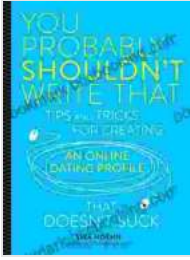
6. Get feedback from friends

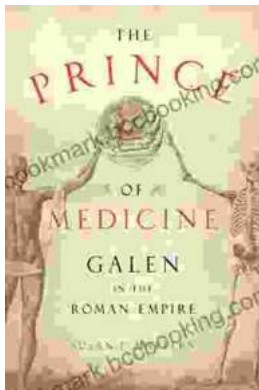
