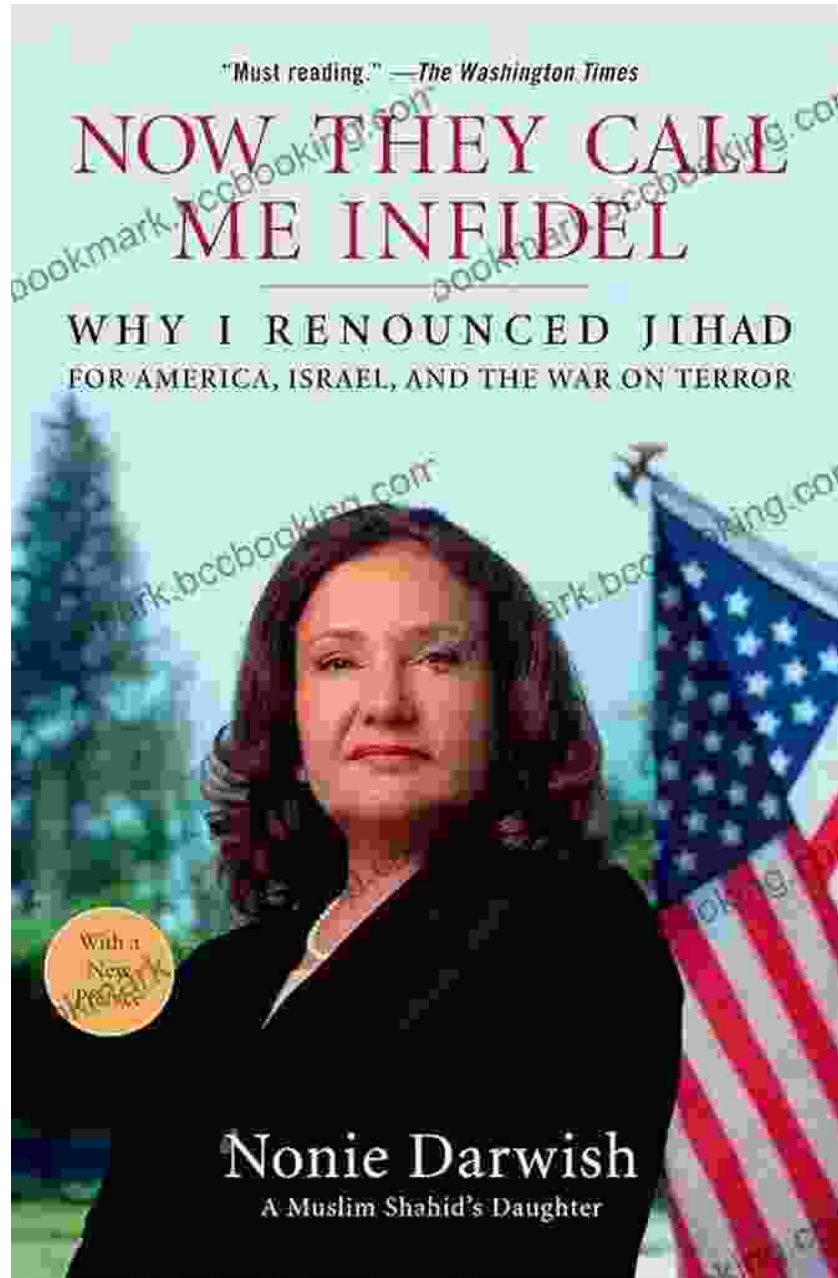


Why I Renounced Jihad for America, Israel, and the War on Terror

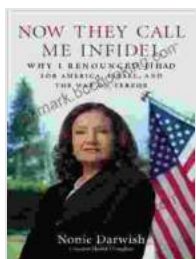

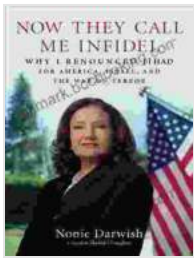

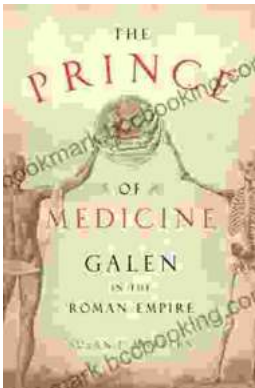
